

# MAE10 Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

## Textbook FAQ:

1. Using the 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> (or earlier) edition versus the 5<sup>th</sup> edition

Earlier editions of the textbook are generally the same in terms of content, with one exception. There were changes to the way that user-defined functions are created starting with MATLAB R2016b which are not described in earlier editions of the textbook. Additionally, note that there are often slight changes in page numbering and other edits between editions that you will be responsible for figuring out on your own if you choose to use a different edition. We provide suggested reading and assignments based on the 5<sup>th</sup> edition. Therefore, if you get a different edition, you will be responsible for correlating your edition with the 5<sup>th</sup> edition to ensure you are following correctly. If you have not already purchased the textbook, you can check for used copies at The Hill (UCI's on-campus bookstore) or any other retailer as they are usually reasonably priced, but do sell out quickly.

2. Using the international edition of the textbook

The international editions of textbooks are *usually* equivalent to the regular editions in terms of content. However, there are typically differences in the page numbers and other slight variations that you will be responsible for figuring out on your own (as with using an earlier edition). We will provide the suggested reading and assignments based on the layout in the current, standard edition. So in summary, you are buying it at your own risk, given that you don't know the exact differences versus the standard 5<sup>th</sup> edition.

3. Using an electronic (e.g., PDF) versus paper copy

You are free to purchase an electronic version of the book instead of buying a hard, paper copy of the book. We will never require you to physically carry or bring your MATLAB book to lecture or discussion. Note that you may be spending many hours reading from the textbook, and consider if you are willing to do this from a computer screen.
